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A39. DIAL MOBILE RADIOTELEPHONE SERVICE

39.3 SPECIAL CONDITIONS

(A) DEFINITION

Dial Mobile Radiotelephone Service is communications service through a land radiotelephone base station between a wire telephone and dial mobile radio telephone or between two dial mobile radiotelephones.

One-way Personal Signaling Service is communications from a base station to a mobile receiver or to multi-point mobile receivers and/or fixed locations.

(B) AVAILABILITY OF SERVICE

Dial Mobile Radiotelephone Service and Personal Signaling Services are available to mobile units and/or receivers equipped for such service when within range of a land radiotelephone station through which such service is furnished and subject to transmission, atmospheric, terrain and like limitations.

(C) PROVISION OF EQUIPMENT

The radio equipment on the mobile unit will be furnished, installed and maintained by the customer. The customer shall also furnish and maintain a suitable power supply.

Radio equipment in the mobile unit furnished, installed and maintained by the customer shall, at all times, be properly licensed by the Federal Communications Commission and shall meet the required specifications and standards of the Utility.

(D) ON PEAK RATES APPLY BETWEEN THE HOURS OF 8:00 AM AND 8:00 PM

Off peak rates apply between the hours of 8:00 PM and 8:00 AM daily plus Saturday and Sunday.

On peak/off peak charging shall commence when the customer has utilized 25 minutes of air time per month. Minutes of use will be measured from the time of channel seizure to channel disconnect on both incoming and outgoing calls. Minutes of use will not apply on those calls where there is no answer or the line is busy.

39.3 SPECIAL CONDITIONS

(E) UTILITY UNDERTAKING

The Utility's obligation to furnish service is dependent upon its ability to secure and retain suitable facilities and rights for the construction and maintenance of the necessary circuits and equipment. In case of a shortage of facilities the Utility will determine the order of precedence for establishment of service from applications received.

(F) OBLIGATION OF CUSTOMER MAINTENANCE

- (1) The customer shall furnish, install, and maintain the storage battery, charging equipment, and noise suppressors on his mobile unit required for the proper operation of the service.
- (2) The calling party (or customer) shall establish his identity in the course of any communication as often as the Utility may deem necessary.
- (3) The calling party (or customer) shall be solely responsible for establishing identity of the person or persons with whom connection is made at the called station.
- (4) Dial Mobile Radiotelephone Service and Personal Signaling Services are intended only for communications in which the customer has a direct interest and shall not be used for any purpose for which payment or other compensation shall be received by him from any other person, firm or corporation for such use, or in the collection, transmission or delivery of any communication for others.

(G) RESPONSIBILITY OF THE UTILITY

In view of the fact that the customer has exclusive control of his communication over the facilities furnished him by the Utility and of the other uses for which facilities may be furnished him by the Utility, and because of inherent inability to avoid errors incident to the services and to the use of such facilities of the Utility, the services and the facilities furnished by the Utility are subject to the terms, conditions and limitations herein specified.

39.3 SPECIAL CONDITIONS - (Cont'd)

(G) RESPONSIBILITY OF THE UTILITY - (Cont'd)

- (1) The liability of the Utility for interruption of service, allowances for omissions, delays or errors is set forth in Cal. P.U.C. Schedule A2, Rule 24, "Limitations of Liability".
- (2) The Utility shall not be liable for damage caused by accident or injury occasioned by the use of Dial Mobile Radiotelephone and Personal Signaling Services when such accident or injury is not due to the negligence of the Utility.
- (3) When the line of other telephone Utilities are used in establishing connections, the Utility shall not be liable for any act or omission of such other Utility or Utilities.

(H) INITIAL CONTRACT PERIOD AND TERMINATION OF SERVICE BY CUSTOMER

- (1) The initial contract period for service shall be two months.
- (2) The supplying of service by the Utility may be terminated by the customer, in whole or in part, at any time, subject to payment of all charges relating to the period during which service was rendered; provided, however, that charges shall be paid for the full initial contract period if termination shall occur within such period.

(I) ADVANCE PAYMENTS

Applicants for service will be required to make an advance payment, equal to the installation charges and one month's charge for the service to be provided, at the time the application is taken. The amount of the advance payment is credited to the customer's account on the first bill rendered under the contract.

(J) PAYMENT FOR SERVICE

The customer is required to pay all charges for service in accordance with the Utility's regular billing and collection practices.

39.3 SPECIAL CONDITIONS - (Cont'd)

(K) DEPOSITS

The Utility may, in order to safeguard its interests, require an applicant or customer to make a suitable deposit to be held by the Utility as a guarantee of the payment of charges. Such deposits in no way relieves the applicant or customer from complying with the Utility's regulations as to advance payments and the prompt payment of bills on presentation. At such time as the contract is terminated, the amount of the deposit is credited to the customer's account and any credit balance which may remain is refunded. At the option of the Utility, such deposit may be refunded or credited to the customer at any time prior to termination of the contract. Interest on deposits is covered in Cal. P.U.C. Schedule A2, Rule 7, "Deposits".

(L) DIRECTORY ERRORS

The liability of the Utility for errors or omissions in directory listings is set forth in Cal. P.U.C. Schedule A2, Rule 24, "Limitation of Liability".

(M) DENIAL OF SERVICE

In the event of the non-payment of any sum due, the use of foul or profane expressions, the impersonation of another with fraudulent intent, or of any other violation of the lawful regulation of the Utility, or any violation of the F.C.C.'s rules and regulations applicable to these services, the Utility may terminate the contract.

Upon the use of the service for the purpose of performing any service in competition with the service which the Utility may now or hereafter furnish, the Utility may, by notice in writing to the customer without incurring any liability, forthwith discontinue the furnishing of said service and terminate the contract.

(N) LIMITED CONVERSATION

The Utility reserves the right to limit the length of conversation when necessary in times of emergency resulting in a shortage of facilities.

39.3 SPECIAL CONDITIONS - (Cont'd)

(O) ORDER OF PRECEDENCE IN ADDING MOBILE UNITS

When facilities in a given area are insufficient to permit furnishing mobile telephone service to all who desire such service, applications for service to new customers or to additional mobile units of existing customers shall be filled in accordance with categories of precedence in the order listed below. All applications in the same category shall be filled in the order in which they are received and all such applications shall have precedence over applications in a lower category.

Category 1 - Public Safety and Health

Official federal, state, county, and municipal government agencies protecting the public safety and health; private organizations and persons engaged primarily in protecting the public safety and health, such as physicians, hospitals, ambulance services, volunteer fire departments, American Red Cross, licensed protective patrols and armored cars and similar agencies.

Category 2 - Public Service

Contract carriers, common carriers and public utilities, (exclusive of taxicabs and livery service), for communications other than correspondence of the general public.

Category 3 - Quasi Public Service

Emergency repair organizations, not included in Category 1, protecting health and property, press associations, newspapers and broadcasting stations.

Category 4 - Physically Handicapped

Persons who, because of physical handicaps, operate specially equipped vehicles and are unable to leave such vehicles without assistance.

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A39. DIAL MOBILE RADIOTELEPHONE SERVICE

39.3 SPECIAL CONDITIONS - (Cont'd)

(O) ORDERING OF PRECEDENCE IN ADDING MOBILE UNITS - (Cont'd)

Category 5 - Industrial

Gas or oil producing or drilling operators; producers and distributors of fuel and lumber and other construction materials and equipment; food processing, distribution and storage organizations, producers of substantial quantities of food; business concerns engaged in construction of housing and industrial or public works; taxicabs and livery service.

Category 6 - Traveling Public

Trains and watercraft where service is made available to passengers.

Category 7 - All Others

(P) MULTI-MESSAGE UNIT AND LONG DISTANCE CALLS

Charges on multi-message unit and long distance calls are determined by the rate center for the principal exchange of the base station through which the call is completed.

(Q) PERSONAL SIGNALING SERVICE

- (1) The minimum billing period is one month, for service furnished in excess of one month, the final bill will be adjusted for the proportional period for which service was rendered.
- (2) The Utility undertakes only to transmit a signal for the purpose of actuating a signal on the paging receiver and accepts no responsibility for the transmission of further intelligence.
- (3) Each customer-provided receiver in operation and billed under a single telephone number will be charged the monthly service rate applicable to the number of services involved. The monthly rate is found by determining the number of services in operation; locating its place in the appropriate rate step as shown under RATES above, and applying the associated monthly rate to all services. This rate will be adjusted up or down as services are added or removed and as rate step division point is crossed. Rates specified herein are available only to end users. Service purchased at such rates may not be resold.

39.3 SPECIAL CONDITIONS - (Cont'd)

(Q) PERSONAL SIGNALING SERVICE - (Cont'd)

- (4) Monthly charges for Personal Signaling Services shall be billed monthly in advance, with the first month's charge being payable upon initial subscription to this service. Message charges will be billed monthly in arrears.
- (5) Message allowance for multiple access accounts will be the sum of the total access numbers times the individual allowance. No additional allowance for assigned additional numbers (dual address).
- (6) A message may consist of a selective time signal or a selective tone signal followed by a brief voice message or a display readout. A voice message will utilize a maximum of ten (10) seconds of frequency time.

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
